# Identifying/ Assessing Your Student

You fill out a home language survey when enrolling your child

If there is another language besides English at home, your child is screened with the WIDA MODEL or W-APT in speaking/listening (K-12) and reading/writing (1-12)

## Parent Notification: An Explanation of WIDA Levels

- Level 6- Student's speaking, listening, reading and writing is comparable to English only speaking peers
- Level 5- Student is almost comparable with English speaking peers
- Level 4- Student makes some mistakes but others can still understand them
- Level 3- Student makes mistakes and it is hard to understand them at times
- Level 2- Student uses short phrases/ sentences and general words
- Level 1- Student uses words/phrases and relies on pictures

### **ELL Program Instruction**

- Your student will have a combination of instruction in the ELL classroom and in their content classrooms
- Levels 1-3 will receive more time from the ELL teacher in learning general English
- Levels 4-6 will receive support from the ELL teacher in learning content specific English

#### **Annual Assessments**

- Every January, all ELL students will be given the WIDA ACCESS test
- Screens listening, speaking, reading and writing
- Results will be reported in the late Spring and mailed home
- Reports may be translated, if parents' request

## Exiting

- Your student will be exited from the ELL program when they have received a 5.0 or higher in every domain
- They have passed the MCAS

## Monitoring

- Your student will be monitored for four years by the ELL teacher
- Your child may receive limited in-class support
