#### 1. Executive Session:

Subsequent to a roll call vote in Regular Session on a motion brought by Malcolm Astley, seconded by Donna Bouchard, the School Committee <u>voted</u> unanimously (5-0) to enter into Executive Session per M.G.L. Chapter 30A, §21(a)(7) under Chapter 214 §1B (right to privacy) because of confidential information as received from our auditor related to the METCO account and to discuss which authorities to pursue to resolve the METCO accounts, and to review the Executive Session minutes of December 2, 2013 under M.G.L. 30A §22. 2. Continued Discussion of Next Steps re: METCO Account (M.G.L. 30A §21(a)(7):

Barb updated the School Committee on the potential investigation by the contacted Jim Powers for information regarding the METCO accounts, which aim provided to them. Jim was also asked to keep their conversation confidential, although he could inform the Chair of the School Committee.

Barb consulted Gini Tate who advised Barb concerning the OML's exemption to be relied upon for this executive session. Gini advised that the School Committee avoid interference with any potential investigation going forward, and not publicly discuss the sequest. However, Gini recommended that the Committee could draft a letter to the sexing if the accounts are being investigated for criminal activity, which could fulfill the School Committee's inductory responsibility. The Committee reviewed a letter drafted by Beth; Gini will also be asked to review it.

The School Committee discussed their actions taken up to the present and what course of action should be taken going forward. Suggestions were made about how to proceed, even though the office may be investigating the matter. If the Committee decides to contact an agency with subpoena power, it was agreed that the Inspector General's charge was most in line with the Committee's responsibility.

Donna made a motion to send the letter that was drafted to the Inspector General. There was no second. The discussion continued about preserving the confidentiality of the equest when communicating with the Inspector General.

in an effort to maintain confidentiality, Barb will ask Mark Lanza to call the state Ethics Commission to understand how the Committee's investigation, including contacting the Inspector General, could impact other state agencies' investigations.
