3. Discussion of proposed Happy Hollow School Improvement Plan

The UNITED goals have been the six goals for the past number of years. There are four goals that Happy Hollow is going to present when it's our turn to present. The three elementary schools work on these together. Some differences, but all within the same goals. We have a real interest at Happy Hollow to move towards and educate ourselves in Restorative Justice practices. Of the six goals, we are looking at the Elevating Achievement goal. Lots of conversation about what exactly the students missed or didn't miss during the pandemic. As a country, kids did ok with reading. Less ok with math. Even less with writing. The kids really missed out on the social/emotional component. We are still seeing the repercussions of this in the building today. You will see that reflected in these goals. Tricia reads the first goal. Many of the goals at the elementary level are to utilize the data from i-Ready and ELA assessments.

Tricia reads the second goal. Though the tracking doesn't begin until Middle School, we can support our students of color who would benefit from more advanced instruction.

Tricia reads the third goal. This one is about vertical alignment in math.

Tricia reads the fourth goal. This is about the social/emotional development of each student.

Thoughts/questions/suggestions?

Andrea: Since Open Circle is no longer a program, some of our newer teachers might not be trained in Open Circle.

Tricia: At HH, our guidance teachers still use Open Circle, but you are correct, we will have to adjust accordingly.

Prashant: General question about philosophy: how much of education research do we actually rely on as we make the priorities? How does that play into setting policies? Tricia: The folks who are creating these goals are very well informed. State mandates us to choose programs that are research based.

4. Discussion of HH Budget

Is not releasing out of this meeting because it is a working draft. There is not much money that Tricia has control over. First few pages are salaries.

Takes years for personnel additions.

Classroom supplies, software licensing, replacement materials, conference, etc.

Capital Budget is all done at a district level-it is not within the realm of influence of principal.

The budget will be made public after it is presented to School Committee, then Finance Committee then to the town.

Question: Do you write grants? Tricia: We don't usually qualify for grants because we are Wayland but we do qualify for some grants like Title 1 money.

Question: Have you thought about sponsors? Tricia: There are a lot of laws around who we accept money from. Lots of regulations and rules. Central Office and the director of Finance have the final say about that.
